



Appendix III – Definition of "Haredim" (ultra-Orthodox) for the purpose of providing MAOF Services to the Haredi Population

An SME owner or entrepreneur wishing to receive services under these Rules and Regulations is required to meet the following criteria:

"Haredim"

Religious Jews who are unique in their religious observance, education methods, community and lifestyle, that distinguishes them from other observant Jews, and who meet one or more of the following criteria, acceptable to the Committee:

1. He and / or his spouse attended a Haredi educational institution recognized by the Ministry of Education.
2. Their children attended Haredi educational institutions recognized by the Ministry of Education, up to the age of 18.
3. The employee or his spouse were granted exemption from military service under the Defense Service Law (Consolidated Version), 5746-1986, due to their affiliation with the Haredi community, or could have been granted exemption from military service under the Defense Service Law (Consolidated Version), 5746-1986 due to their affiliation with the Haredi community, but chose to carry out military / civilian service.
4. He studied at a yeshiva (for undergraduate students) or attended a Haredi *kollel* (yeshiva for married men) supported by the Department of Torah Institutions in the Ministry of Education. He studied at an ultra-Orthodox teacher training college, supervised and budgeted by the Ministry of Education.
5. The employee's place of residence appears on the list of Haredi statistical areas and towns with level 1 homogeneity, according to the publications of the Central Bureau of Statistics, provided that the employee has failed to prove that he / she meets the definition of "Haredim", as stated in Sections 3.10.1 - 3.10.4.
